- 2. Growth of the Pentecostal Movement
 - a. It spread to Chicago, Winnipeg, and New York.
 - b. Soon after 1906 A.D. it could be found on every continent.
 - c. Today there are at least 26 church bodies that consider themselves a part of it. Some of the larger ones in the United States are as follows:

 - (d) Governmental Structure-basically episcopal with the General Assembly being the Legislative body. The Presiding Bishop is presently Bishop J. O. Patterson,
