4. Beliefs and Practices of Pentecostal or charismatic Christians (See page 3 of the Galkp Foll)

5. A comparison of Pentecostal or charismatic Christians, taken as a whole, and Pentecostal or charismatic Christians who are tongues speakers with the general populace and with evangelicals.

The Pentecostal or charismatic Christians, taken as a whole, are more like the general populace, whereas the tongues speakers are more like the evangelicals.

- 6. Similarities between the Pentecostal or charismatic Christians who are tongues speakers and the evangelicals:
  - (a) They are approximately nine-tenths Protestant and one tenth Catholic.
  - (b) They hold both to the deity of Christ and the full truthfulness of all that is taught in Scripture.
  - (c) Their only hope for heaven is through personal faith in Jesus Christ.
  - (d) They acknowledge the existence of a personal devil who influences human beings for evil.
  - (e) They give generously to religious causes.
  - (f) They read the Bible faithfully.
  - (g) They acknowledge the Bible as the most important religious authority for their life, and even place it over direct religious guidance of the Holy Spirit which is their second most important religious authority.
  - (h) They set high priority on winning others to Christ and witness to others about their faith.
  - (i) They are members of a church.
  - (j) They do volunteer work for their church.
  - (k) They disapprove of sexual relations before marriage.
  - (1) They do not use alcoholic beverages.

Note: The Pentecostal or charismatic Christians who are tongues speakers make up 40% of the evangelicals.

7. Differences between the Pentecostal or charismatic Christians who are tongues speakers and other evangelicals.
