(a) Number of women

The Pentecostal or charismatic Christians, taken as a whole, have about the same number of men and women and 42% of the tongues speakers in that group are women whereas 62% of the evangelicals are women and only 38% men.

(b) Winning the world for Christ.

Some tongues-speaking Pentecostals or charismatic Christians give a slightly lower priority to winning the world for Christ than do other evangelicals.

(c) Knowledge of Scripture truth

The Pentecostal or charismatic Christians who are tongues speakers do far better than other evangelicals in knowing that Jesus said to Nicademus "Ye must be born again," but much worse than other evangelicals in their ability to recall five of the Ten Commandments.

(d) Political affiliation

The Pentecostal or charismatic Christians who are tongues speakers have significantly fewer Democrats than the general populace (36% vs. mid 40's% for all other groups) and a higher percentage of independents (10% higher than any other group) whereas the evangelicals are likely to have a slightly higher percentage of Republicans than the general populace of Republicans and fewer independents.
