derived from Rome's pagan Saturnalia (the festival of Saturn that began December 17) that was noted for its revelry.

K. Attitude of the Jehovah's Witnesses toward Drinking and Smoking.

The Jehovah's Witneses have no specific ban on drinking alcholic beverages, but anyone who drinks to excess will be disfellowshiped. The Jehovah's Witnesses say that smoking pollutes the body and therefore should be avoided.

- III. A Survey of the Key Doctrines of the Jehovah's Witnesses
 - A. Doctrine of Jesus Christ

The Jehovah's Witnesses believe that Jesus Christ was an angel, then a man, and then an angel again, but they do not believe Jesus Christ is God.

Note the following beliefs of the Jehovah's Witnesses about Jesus Christ:

- 1. His Prehuman State
 - He was the first creation of God (Rev. 3:14; Col. 1:15; and Prov. 8:22)
 - b. He was an angel who was known in Heaven as Michael, the archangel (Jude 9)
 - c. He had a prehuman existence (John 8:58)
 - d. He shared with Jehovah in creating all other things (Col. 1:16,17 and John 1:1-3,10 cf. Gen. 1:26)
