- h. Psa. 32:6 "... Surely in respect to a flood of many waters, they will not reach unto him."
 - -Pioture: If a pious one confesses and prays, then he will be like a person on a high rock out of reach of the raging flood below. David is safe and secure from God's chastisement.
 - -Note this flood is a chastisement for believers.
- i. Psa. 32:7 "You are my hiding place; you preserve me from distress."
- -Distress in the context is the result of unconfessed sin.
 - -Picture: David is walled in and surrounded by God's protection from the distress which would result from unconfessed sin.
- j. Psa. 32:8 Context is very important.
 - -Note that David has been chastened, has confessed sin, and has been delivered from further chastening.
 - -David wants to remain safe from future distress which would result form unconfessed sin.
 - -God here responds and shows how David can be safe.
 - God: "I will instruct you ..." implies teacher-pupil relationship.
 - "... in the way which you should go."

 In the context, "the way" is the way of confession when David sinned. Is not general guidance!

 -"You" is singular, implying David.
 - "I will counsel (you) [to go in the way of confession] with my eye upon you."
 - -Idea: With a slight indication I will warn you to go and confess you sin.
 - -This indicator is a quilty conscience.
 - -If you sin, I will give you an indication (through your conscience). If you heed it and confess your your sin, I will protect you from the chastisement which would result from unconfessed sin.
 - -If you are sensitive to your conscience, I will not throw bricks at you.
