- 2. The Greek Titles.
 - «. ψαλμοι from ψαλμος.

This title is used in the <u>Septuagint</u>, and it means "songs sung to a musical accompaniment."

-Note this is not a translation of the Hebrew title.

b. yaxrnpior

This title is used occasionally in Hellenistic Greek, and it means "songs sung to the accompaniment of a stringed instrument (psaltery)."

O. BIBZY YAZMWY

This title is used in the New Testament, and it means "book of psalms" or "book of pious songs." Is used in the NT in <u>Luke 20:42</u> and <u>Acts 1:20</u>.

- 3. The English Titles.
 - a. Psaims.

This title means "sQured songs." It comes from the Greek word $\psi \alpha \lambda \mu o l$ which is the title used for the book of Psalms in the Septuagint.

b. Psalter.

This title means "songs sung to the accompaniment of a psaltery." It comes from the Greek word $\psi \alpha \lambda \gamma \rho \cos \psi$ which is the title used occasionally for the book of Psalms in Hellenistic Greek.

D. The Authors of the Book of Psalms.

-102 Psalms give their author; 48 do not give a name.
