VII. Authorship and date of Joshua

A. Authorship

- 1. There is no definite answer as to who wrote Joshua, but a good guess would be Joshua himself.
- 2. In chapter 24, we are told that Joshua wrote on a document the covenant that was made at Shechem between the Israelites and the Lord where the covenant was renewed.
- 3. If he wrote that he certainly could have written the rest of the book.
- 4. And who better to write the rest of the book than Joshua, Moses' successor.
- He could have written the whole book except 24:29-33 which is about his own death.
- 6. The Talmud says that Joshua wrote his won book and that he also wrote the last 8 verses in Deut.

B. Date

- 1. If Joshua wrote it, it would have to be completed shortly before his death.
- 2. Joshua was 110 years old before he died.
- 3. Most people think that at 1449 B. C. that Joshua was at least 40 years old.
- 4. After the Exodus, you have certain things which have to take place.
 - i. One of those things is the 40 yrs wilderness wanderings.
 - ii. Then you've got the conquest of Canaan which took 7 years.
 - a. How do we prove this.
 - b. Joshua 14,6-10
 - Caleb comes to Joshua and says, "Joshua, when we were at Kadesh Barnea, I was 40 years old. The Lord has preserved me for 45 years so that I can get this land."
 - 2) Now when Caleb is speaking to Joshua, the land has been conquered so the conquest has already taken place.
 - The Lord has preserved him alive 45 years from Kadesh Barnea to this time.
 - c. Turn to Deut 2:14
 - 1) It took 38 years for all the men 20 years old and upward. to are
 - 2) Starting at that point, they are going to conquer.
 - d. Thus, 45 38 = 7 years to conquer the land of Canaan.
